

# Dr Martin Nicastro

## Curriculum Vitae

**Research interests:** My research focuses on the relationship between live music and urban space. I am interested in how data visualization tools, such as GIS and network analysis, allow new insights into live music ecosystems and support their sustainability. In my PhD research, I have analysed the live music scene of Milan during the first post-war economic boom (1958-1962). By applying a hybrid approach, which included an innovative combination of field research and digital mapping, I demonstrated how urban structure shaped the networks that connected music practitioners. This influenced music products by promoting the emersion of new practices and a unique crosspollination between genres. In my current position as research fellow at the University of Pavia, I am continuing to explore the historiographical potential of data-driven tools by applying network analysis to the relations between publishers, composers and producers in Italian film industry (1958-1976). As lead developer for the international initiative Live Music Mapping Project, I am also producing several mapping applications. Within the project, I have created open-source solutions for challenges such as the time-based incorporation of statistical data, full music sector visualisation, and UI mobile access.
